### Baptists in Convention.

This has been a great week in Newberg for the Baptist church. On Monday evening the Oregon Baptist Ministers Conference met and organized at the Baptist church with Rev. F. N. Baker, of Ashland, presiding. Words of welcome were spoken by the local pastor, Rev. F. C. Stannard, the president responding.

Later the state conference of the church has been in session, meetings being held in the morning, afternoon and evening.

The attendance has been large, delegates being present from all over the state, including such prominent ministers as J. Whitcomb Brougher, Alexander Blackburn, A. W. Ryder of the foreign mission board, as well as many others. Dr. C. M. Hill, president of the Baptist Theological Seminary at Berkeley, was also present, occupying a prominent place on the program.

The delegates have been entertained in the homes of our citizens with meals at noon and in the evening being furnished in the basement of the church.

### A Serious Accident.

Sam McVey and Bert Turnbow met with a very serious accident at the bridge over Chehalem Creek on the Dayton road last Sunday morning, and they were fortunate in escaping with their lives. They started to cross the bridge from the south with the Henry Hagey traction engine and when they were over the mill race the bridge gave way and engine and both men fell twenty-five feet, landing at the bottom of the race.

Sam jumped when he saw they were going down and went into water up to his neck, while Turnbow was caught by the heel of one shoe and went down with the engine. Neither of them were badly hurt by the fall but both received some burns from escaping steam. Sam is pretty severely burned on one leg and the wound is liable to give him a good deal of trouble.

About forty feet of the bridge went down and travel that way has been entirely suspended. The engine don't appear to be badly wrecked, considering the distance it fell. Mills and Ames are at work with a force of men endeavoring to raise it.

It is said the law was complied with by laying plank on the bridge in front of the engine, but it proved to be too weak to stand the heavy strain.
