Watkins' Jubilee Singers will
 be here Friday and Saturday
 evenings Nov. 13-14. The enter-
 tainment will be given in Dun-
 cans hall, under the auspices of
 the Student Body. The proceeds
 will be used in purchasing a pi-
 ano for the H. S. Assembly room.
 Our purpose is worthy and a lib-
