Just two weeks from today Taft will take the bat.

On and after Saturday afternoon all Oregon will breathe easier. The lamented legislature will have ceased from troubling.

The fellow, who furnished the copy for that doggerel published in the News Reporter last week, under the title of "From the cradle to the grave, or from the log cabin to the White House," ought to have died young. The Graphic extends sympathy to brother Hammerly, realizing from several years experience that it takes courage to turn down the fellow, who has a few lines of poetry (?) for the paper, which he thinks will make the readers rub their eyes and wonder, who in the country is able to pen such soul inspiring stuff.

County Fruit Inspector C. E. Newhouse says he finds many people who have the mistaken idea that the little cold spell we had in January destroyed the San Jose scale, the codling moth and all other pesky insects that bother the life of the fruit grower. When in countries where the mercury runs as low as 40 below zero the life is not pinched out of the bugs, it is folly to suppose that a little freeze-up such as we had here in the Willamette valley will do them hurt. Growers who fail to handle the spray nozzle will rue it.

A particularly interesting story is told of the manner in which the news that Secretary Root had refused Russia's demand for the extradition of Christian Rudowitz was broken to the fugitive from Russian "justice." The Associated Press says: "The good news from Washington was slow in reaching Christian Rudowitz. There was no one at the jail where the prisoner had been confined who could speak Russian, and attempts to reach his lawyers with the Associated Press bulletin found them absent. Meanwhile the bailiffs and guards already in possession of the news bulletin were fairly aching to impart the good tidings to the man most affected. Rudowitz gazed stolidly at them. Presently one of them had an inspiration. He resorted to pantomime. He imitated the click of a telegraph instrument by tapping on the bars of the cell; then he pointed out doors, seized the Russian's hands, grinned broadly, jumped up and down and patted the prisoner on the back. Slowly the latter broke into a smile and pointing interrogatively to the east—Washington—grunting, 'Huh?' Whereat the guards nodded their heads vigorously and the indications were that Rudowitz at least comprehended that something fortunate had happened to him."

The New Cabinet.

Taft has made a decided departure from the custom which has long been in vogue by incoming presidents, in that he has announced a number of selections already made for cabinet positions. The announcement comes however from his closest advisers and consequently some changes may be made before the inauguration takes place. The list so far made up is as follows: Secretary of State—Philander C. Knox, Pennsylvania. Secretary of the Treasury—George M. Reynolds, Illinois, or some other Illinois man. Secretary of War—No selection. Attorney-General—George W.

Wickersham, New York. Postmaster-General—Frank H. Hitchcock, Massachusetts. Secretary of the Navy—George von L. Meyer, Massachusetts. Secretary of the Interior—Richard A. Ballinger, Washington. Secretary of Agriculture—James Wilson, Iowa. Secretary of commerce and Labor—Charles Nagel, Missouri. It is expected that Mr. Taft will soon decide upon the Secretary of War. The man selected will probably be a Southern Republican, preferably from one of the border states—Kentucky, Tennessee, or perhaps Virginia.
