Inventor of the Sewing Machine.

Ninety years ago today Elias Howe, inventor of the sewing machine, the great boon to womanhood, was born in Spencer, Massachusetts. In early life Howe was a poor mechanic, determined to lessen the labor which he perceived was a hardship upon his wife. It was primarily for her sake that he spent years in contriving the first machine. Thus a woman, as usual, furnished the inspiration for great endeavor.

Howe's first machine was patented in May, 1841. It was a crude contrivance, and bore little resemblance to the handsome perfected machines now turned out from the great factory in Elizabeth, which has made New Jersey the centre of the sewing machine industry of today. But marvel of marvels, Howe's mechanism worked, and the proud inventor had the pleasure of seeing his wife accomplish in days what had formerly required weeks.

The world has never had much respect for innovators, and Howe's path was not strewn with roses. Conservations argued that women had always done the family sewing by hand. Some super-pious men went so far as to denounce Howe's machine as an invention of His Satanic Majesty, and argued that if women were released from the slavery of the needle, and given more leisure, the devil would find work for their idle hands to do.

In his first attempts to introduce the sewing machine in America Howe failed miserably. Undaunted, he went to England, but met with so many rebuffs that he sold the English patent for \$1250. Returning to America, Howe found that his patent had been utilized by a wealthy company, which sought to realize all the financial fruits of his genius. Howe succeeded in maintaining his rights, however, and with the increasing popularity of his invention became wealthy. He served as a private in the Civil war, and died in Brooklyn in 1867.—Eugene Guard.

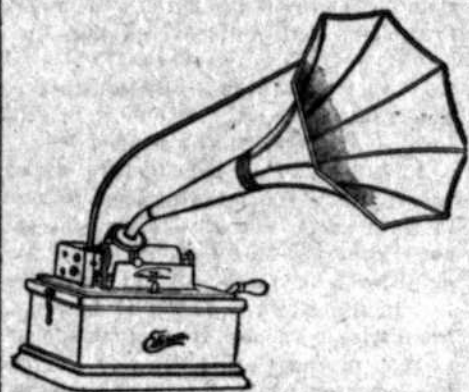
