Oregon Osteopaths in Annual Session.

Following is the program of the 8th annual meeting of the Oregon Osteopathic Association held in Portland, January 8, 10. There are nearly 70 D. O.'s in the state, and over 50 of them were present.

Symposium of Demonstrations in charge of Dr. E. T. Parker, (a) Examination of Patients (b) Technic of Lesion Correction.
Dr. Lena Hodges, of Astoria, brought an 19 months old babe with her, which, because of scoliosis (curvature) of the spine had been paralyzed in the limbs and unable to move finger or toe; three months' orthodox treatment had given no benefit, and the former physicians had given the child up. The mother was delighted to have found Dr. Hodges. There were other cases of curvature, tuberculosis of the hip cerebellar ataxia, subluxation of the innominate (the joint between the ilium and sacrum) and prepatellar bursa or "house maid's knee" (a sac or swelling on the limb just in front of the knee-cap.) One of the teachers from here was present and has nothing but praise for the physicians, their demonstrations and discussions.

The Journal of the A. O. A. says of the last July Exam. before the State Board of Oregon: "Eighty-three per cent osteopaths and fifty-eight per cent M. D.'s passed the board. Ten out of twelve D. O.'s succeeded and fifty-eight out of a hundred M. D.'s Dr. Lola L. Haight, osteopath .09 of Los Angeles, had second highest grade of all the applicants, eighty-eight and three-fourths average, one M. D. had eighty-nine. The osteopathic member of the Board, Dr. F. E. Moore, LaGrande, Oregon, said: "I was proud of the D. O.'s"

What can better show the qualifications than the outcome in examinations? Does this look like osteopaths "Can't pass?" This experience right here at home—in good old Oregon—has been duplicated in many other states, and especially in California. According to the San Francisco Call a blind man, an osteopath, Dr. C. A. Whiting ranked 1st in the examination last summer. He had 127 M. D. competitors too. Remember that no examiner knows whose Ms. he is grading. They all go by No. not name Rather poor policy, isn't it, for them to sneer at the qualifications of osteopaths in view of the facts in the case?
