Annual Stockholders Meeting Newberg Brick and Tile Company.

At the Annual Meeting of the Stockholders of the Newberg Brick and Tile Company, of Newberg, Oregon, held January 26, 1910, at 1:20 P.M., the following important business was transacted:

In order to meet the growing demand for the "Newberg Red" Face Brick it was decided to double the capacity of the present dryer, by adding eight more tunnels, and build two additional down-draft brick kilns (one new one being just about completed) each of 100,000 brick capacity.

To do this, and make other improvements, the directors were authorized to take the necessary steps to increase the Capital Stock from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

A dividend of 10 per cent was also declared on last years' business.

The Board of Directors was changed to five members and the following elected: Charles H. Lucas, W. H. Dryer, G. H. Rogers, Portland; E. A. Romig, C. E. Fuller, Newberg.

The Directors later elected these officers: President, Charles H. Lucas; Vice Pres., E. A. Romig; Sec'y. and Treas., C. E. Fuller; Manager, G. H. Rogers.
