Christian Tabernacle Revival Closed.

Pastor Ritchey assisted by Miss Ellen Flook, of Portland, as Song Evangelist has been conducting evangelistic services, in Newberg, for four weeks past. This has been a good meeting and has greatly encouraged this young church. Forty-eight new members were added, twenty-seven of whom were by confession of faith in Jesus and baptism. On Monday evening the Ladies Aid Society and other ladies of the church gave a reception for these new members which was a very enjoyable time. It was made spiritually profitable by the special music rendered by Miss Flook and her two choruses and a sermon by the pastor to the membership.

The membership nearly reaches 200 now. All are very anxious to reach that number by the time of the third anniversary of organization, April 9th, 1910. The Sunday School also has been helped by these meetings reaching 112 during their progress. About 60 are enrolled in Teacher Training classes.

The regular services of the church will now be resumed. Sunday School at 10 a.m. merged into the preaching service without intermission about 11 a.m. Evening service at 7:30 p.m. The church and pastor extend a most cordial invitation to the public to attend any of the services.
