## MILLIONS SPENT ON FRAUDS

Fake Consumption Cures Cheat Public out of \$15,000,000.

Over \$15,000,000 annually is poured into the coffers of those who exploit and advertise fake consumption cures, according to a statement issued to-day by the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis; and for this vast sum the victims receive nothing in return, but are often permanently injured and in the majority of cases cheated out of the chance for a real cure. Worse still, most of this money is paid by those who can least afford it.

The National Association has investigated several hundred so-called "cures" and "treatments" for tuberculosis now being advertised throughout the country, and finds that more than \$3,000,000 a year is being spent in soliciting the patronage of the public. On examination, it has been found that the great majority of these "cures" contain harmful and habit-forming drugs, such as morphine, opium and chloroform. None of them will cure consumption. The only cure for this disease that has ever been discovered is the combination of fresh air, rest and wholesome food. All of the "cures" that attempt to destroy the tubercle bacillus without these or to stop the progress of the disease in some mysterious way are branded as frauds, and impositions.

Three classes of "cures" are distinguished by the National Association. In the first class are included devices and drugs which can be bought for any sum ranging from ten cents to five dollars at a drugstore. The United States Department of Agriculture has just issued a bulletin in which some of the most used of these drugs and remedies are analyzed and condemned. The second class of "cures" includes the "institutes," "professors" or companies of "doctors," who for a consideration guarantee to cure consumption by some secret method of which they are the sole proprietors. There are nearly one hundred and fifty of these institute frauds in the United States, cheating the people out of millions of

dollars annually. In the third class of "cures" are placed a number of home-made remedies, which either through ignorance or superstition have been advanced as treatments for tuberculosis. Some of these are, onions, lemons, rattlesnake poison, coal dust, lime dust, pigs blood, dog oil, milk "strippings," and even alcohol. These will not cure consumption declares the National Association. No drug, gas or other material has yet been discovered, which, when eaten, inhaled or injected into the body, will kill the germs of tuberculosis. Fresh air, which contains more oxygen than any substance known, will destroy the germs of tuberculosis, if it is breathed continuously for a long enough period, and it rest and wholesome food are employed at the same time to build up the body.

### Mrs. Luellen Duncan, Deceased.

Mrs. Luellen Duncan died at her home two miles north of Newberg, Thursday morning, June 30, 1910, after a lingering illness of several months' duration. The deceased was born in Illinois, July 10, 1837; removed with her parents to Kentucky, where a few years of her childhood days were spent, and later, on to Missouri, where she was married to Walter B. Duncan, September 2, 1852. The family came to Oregon in 1876 and settled near Newberg where they have made their home since, Mr. Duncan passing away nine years ago.

Mrs. Duncan was the mother of twelve children nine of whom, three daughters and six sons, are still living; namely, Sarah E. Myer, James C., John W., Thomas B., Robert L. Duncan, all of Newberg; Henry B. Duncan, of Warren, Josephine A. Wright, of Rex, Lucinda Hess, of Newberg, Frank A. Duncan, of Hillsboro. Mrs. Duncan was the daughter of a Baptist minister and a Christian from childhood but was not affiliated with the church until after coming to Newberg. She joined the Baptist church of this place and was baptized by A. Lawrence Black, she and her sister, Mrs. Lucinda Blanchard, being the first persons baptized by Mr. Black. She lived a quiet, consistent life and died in peace with God and men.

### Newberg Baptists Enjoy Reunion and Banquet.

The semi-annual roll call meeting of the local Baptist church which was held Friday evening, July 1st was a very happy occasion. A bountiful supper in the church was the first order, over one hundred partaking. The church then assembled in the auditorium and after song and prayer, the clerk called the roll of members. Those present responded with short talks or scripture quotations, and letters were read from absentees.

Reports show that sixty names have been added to the membership roll during the last year, and eight dismissed, which leaves a net gain of fifty-two, an average of one a week. The present membership is two hundred. The enrollment in the Sunday School is 186, with an average attendance of 120 throughout the year. The financial report showed a total of \$3379.06 raised in all departments of the church; \$354 being for missions. The church is well organized and working harmoniously, seeking to fill place in the community life, and to discharge her obligation to the world.

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
