Baroness de la Roche, driving a Voisin biplane, at Rheims, France, lost her nerve at a height of 50 meters, shut off the power and fell with her machine to the ground. Her legs and arms were broken and she suffered severe contusions.

Joseph Smith, president of the Mormon Church of Utah, was a passenger on the liner Vaderland, which sailed for Dover and Antwerp.

A great scandal, involving ex-Premier George Clemenceau, has broken out in connection with the trial of Henri Rochelle, the well-known French promoter, whose financial institutions, the Franco-Spanish bank and the Credit Minier, were closed in March, 1908, when Rochelle was arrested on charges of extensive swindling. The testimony shows that immense sums of money were made by speculators immediately before the failure.

Secretary of the Interior Ballinger has started on a trip of inspection westward, which may cover a period of several months. He is accompanied by E. C. Finney, assistant to the secretary and a stenographer.

Governor Stubbs received a telegram from Theodore Roosevelt, fixing the day of his one Kansas speech at August 31. He will speak at the John Brown celebration at Ossawatimie, Kan.

Garfield Pleads for Insurgents. CLEVELAND.—Cheered by an audience of "progressive" Republicans as the "people's candidate for Governor of Ohio," James R. Garfield, Monday night, opened the fight to place Ohio in the "insurgent" column. In a two-hour speech, in which he avowed himself an "insurgent," the ex-Secretary of the Interior set forth the platform upon which the "progressive" Republicans of this state will enter the fall campaign.

The meeting was avowedly the christening of the newly organized "progressive Republican" movement in Ohio and its slogan as announced by Mr. Garfield is "Manhood first and property second."

**LOEB IS URGED TO
BECOME CANDIDATE**Collector Does Not Want Gov-
ernorship of New York.
Nomination Likely.

BEVERLY, Mass.—William Loeb, Jr., Collector of the Port of New York, frankly told President Taft Monday that he would rather remain at his post in the customs service than to run for Governor of New York this fall.

The President has frankly told Mr. Loeb that the Republican nomination seemed to be coming his way and that it would take more than a fishing trip to the Rocky Mountains to stop it.

The ex-secretary to President Roosevelt left Beverly Hills for New York, leaving the impression here that if it became necessary for him to take the Republican nomination he would do so and make a whirlwind campaign.

WASHINGTON, D. C., NOTES

Declaring that some companies engaged in the planting of the eucalyptus tree in this country have endeavored to place the government behind exaggerated statements as to the possible results, Forester Graves has issued a warning to the public against extravagant predictions.

Postmaster-General Hitchcock has expressed the opinion that no postal savings bank could be established before January 1, 1911.

Controller of the Treasury Tracewell has rendered a decision holding in effect that in the future he will not allow expenses of office deputies in serving John Doe warrants. The issue came before him on an appeal by Marshal P. M. Long, of the northern district of Alabama, from a ruling by the auditor of the state and other departments in disallowing traveling expenses incurred in endeavoring to serve such warrants in internal revenue cases where the effort to arrest was unsuccessful.

The proposal to transport freight by airship from Arizona to New Mexico will have the effect of bringing the United States and Mexico into an early agreement relative to the first aerial treaty. The Mexican government has approved in a general way the original draft of the treaty which Ambassador de la Barra suggested to Secretary Knox.

**PROGRAMME CAUSES
EMBARRASSMENT**Administration Men Charge
Pinchotites With 'Packing'
Congress at St. Paul.

ST. PAUL, Minn.—Charges that the national conservation program, for the session here in September, has been "packed" with anti-administration speakers, has created a furore in St. Paul. Governor A. O. Eberhardt, discussing the situation, said:

"I think the men at the head of the movement for the congress here are fair-minded enough to change the program if it is not properly balanced."

The "administrationists" want Senator Nelson, and possibly President Taft, placed on the list of speakers, but it is not probable that the president would consent, because his attitude might be misconstrued.

The squabble that has arisen here gives rise to the fear that the congress may be moved to Denver or Kansas City, both of which have made strong bids for it.

Charlton May Go Free.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Porter Charlton, who is under arrest at Hoboken, charged with the murder of his wife at Lake Como, Italy, will not be surrendered in response to a request made by the Italian government for his extradition to Italy for trial. The present intention of officers of the State Department is to decline to surrender him. This means that Charlton will go free, as there is no court in this country with jurisdiction to try him.

Gold Find Arouses Town.

MARSHFIELD, Ore.—It is reported here that there has been much gold found in the mountain about 30 miles southeast of Myrtle Point. There is a rush of people from Myrtle Point to the supposed rich district.

For many years mining has been carried on in that part of the state, but never has paid well.

Socialist Ticket Will Be Named.

KLAMATH FALLS.—For the first time in the history of the county a Socialist ticket will be in the political field here during the coming campaign.
