MANY GOING TO CIRCUS

Newberg Will Be Well Represented in Portland, on Thursday and Friday, August 25-26.

One horse plays landlord and another is the town constable. The other horses make very amusing boarders. Paula Peters' monkey and dog circus holds the attention of the audience for half an hour. A mastiff villain sets fire to the hero's cottage. The dog fire department responds. The captain climbs a ladder and rescues Miss Poodle and an apedetective puts the villain in a cell. Other notables are the Konyot family of riders, the La Faille family of world's strongest men. Winston's equestrian seals, the Dollar family of acrobats, and Victoria Codona, the greatest high-wire artist in the world.

In the menagerie are to be found 1,200 rare wild animals. Among them is Bumbeeno, the only giraffe ever born or exhibited in America. It is but three feet high and worth its weight in gold. There are forty elephants, 700 horses and 1,280 employees. The show travels on a train over a mile in length. The forenoon parade is the most gorgeous affair ever offered by a circus. It cost \$1,000,000.
