At a meeting of the Board of Public Works last night, the city engineer was instructed to advertise for bids for the paving but this he cannot do till after the report of the meeting Thursday evening. At the public hearings on these streets to be paved, preference was expressed for the bitulithic pavement, which has stood the tests better in this city than any other pavement. That a mile in length in James street, having been laid 10 years ago this year, Romans are so well satisfied with it that they designate it as their preference even at a greater cost than other pavements. Horses have never been known to slip on it, and neither do automobiles skid on it and it is just as easily swept and kept clean as is asphalt or other pavements. The brick pavements in this city are in a horrible condition, and there is hardly 100 feet of it that does not need repaving, and as for the asphalt, it is full of "beautiful" cob-web designs, the cracks being so numerous. No bids will be asked for on the creosote wood blocks, a sample of which is in the South James street bridge over the Erie Canal, and it proves to be very slippery, a number of horses having fallen and broken their legs on this pavement. Experience being the best teacher, Romans are certainly satisfied only with the best bitulithic.—Utica N. Y. Press.

OREGON FARMERS ARE ROLLING IN WEALTH

Farmers of the Pacific Northwest are to be envied this year for prices are high and crops abundant. In almost every section the producers are rolling in new wealth.

Thomas Morgan, of Enterprise, harvested \$10,000 worth of grain from one ranch in Union County, and he will grow enough on other ranches near Enterprise to bring his total crop up to 35,000 bushels.

A man in the Table Rock district of Jackson County raised 6,000 sacks of potatoes on 30 acres. These potatoes are now worth, at the Medford depot, \$1.25 per sack, or \$7,500 for the crop from 30 acres.

A farmer in the Molalla district, Clackamas County, has sold \$800 worth of clover seed from eight acres and has 27 tons of clover hay, worth \$270, from the same land.

A hop farmer in the Mission Bottom Country, near Salem, has grown \$40,000 worth of hops on 100 acres. The crop is already sold at that figure.

Every section throughout the state can show similar instances of farmers getting rich. There are unlimited opportunities for others. The farmers of Washington, it is said, will receive \$25,000,000 more for their crops this year than last, and it is probable the increased value in this state will not be much below that figure.
