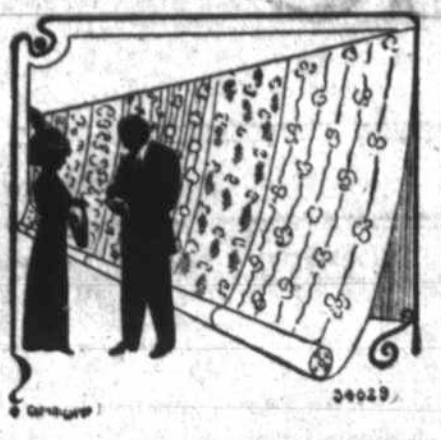

NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT

Notice is hereby given, that the Council of the City of Newberg, Yamhill County, Oregon, propose to improve Main Street from the South line of Sherman Street to the North line of Franklin Street (running West), in the City of Newberg, Oregon, by grading said portion of said street so as to conform to the established grade thereof, by constructing concrete curbs thereon, by providing and constructing street drainage for said portion of said Main Street and by paving with five inch gravel bitulithic pavement the said portion of said Main Street; and

Further notice is hereby given, that the said improvement of said portion of said Main Street shall be made in accordance with and as provided in the plans and specifications filed in the office of the Recorder of the City of Newberg on the 23rd day of December, 1912, and that the estimated cost of said improvement is the sum of \$3250, and that the cost of said improvement is to be assessed to the property abutting said portion of said Main Street and collected in the manner provided in the charter of the City of Newberg, and the laws of the State of Oregon applicable thereto; and
