on tip toe, if it is not necessary.

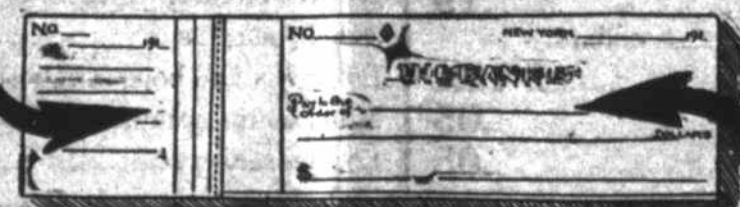
