If the mind is fixed on these ideals and the already known means of approaching them are utilized, heart disease, kidney trouble and the needless miseries that embitter the lives of so many may be left to take care of themselves. It is not so much necessary to fight disease as to cultivate health for the happiness, contentment and moral gain that it brings."
