HOW TO COOK WHALE MEAT

New York Hotel Said to Have Had od Results in Preparation of New Food.

A New York hotel has for some time been featuring whale steaks on its menu, and finds that a considerable demand has been built up among patrons, according to the Hotel Gazette. The meat is purchased frozen and thawed as required. It is all meat, with no fat or bone, having a distinct flavor, not at all fishy, which may be overcome by dipping in hot soda water before cooking. It is somewhat tough, however, and the best results are obtained by cooking slowly a long time with moist heat, low temperature and liberal seasoning. Guests prefer this mest panbroiled in the form of a steak, and 55 cents is charged for a portion, onethird of a pound. Excellent soup stocks, stews, steaks and curries may approximately one-third that of beef. The present price of the frozen meat is 15 cents a pound.
