LONDON STILL BIGGEST CITY

New York Has Not Yet Reached British Metropolis in the Number of Its Inhabitants.

The city of London had a population of only 364,061 on April 25, 1911, when the last British census was taken. At that time it had a so-called night population of only 19,657. This is the original (and only) city of London. The London generally referred to when census figures are considered is the county of London, or "Registration London," so called because it is a unit for the registration of births, deaths, marriages, land transfers and the like. This community had a population of 4,518,021 in 1911 and was estimated in 1914 to have shrunk somewhat. There is still another London—Greater London, embracing the area covered by the metropolitan police. Greater London had a population of 7,251,358 in 1911 and an estimated population of 7,419,704.

For comparison with New York the estimated population of Registration London for 1911 should be used. This was 4,518,021. The city of New York was figured at 4,766,883 by the official census in 1910 and was estimated at 5,468,190 on July 1, 1915. There is also a greater New York that doesn't figure in her census, but this outlying district is not as populous as the London "Outer Belt."
