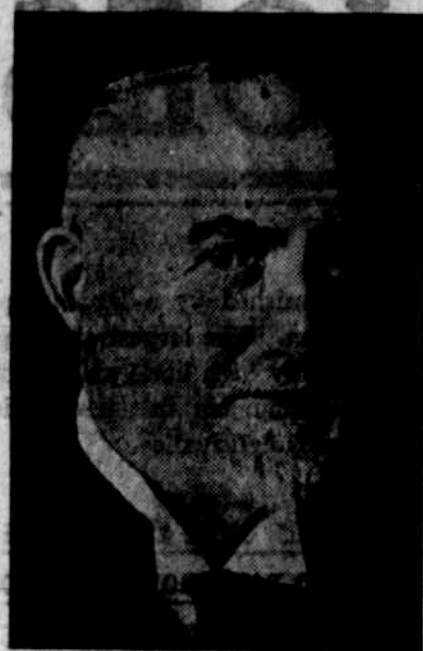


A Few of the Many Reasons Why
