

WAS ONCE "WASTE LAND"

Present Site of Grant Bank in New York City So Described in King's Grant.

In the office of George F. Baker, in the First National bank of New York city, there hangs on the wall the original patent from James H. King of England, dated February 4, 1665, for the land on which the First National bank now stands, therein designated as "waste land" outside the city gate of New York. It was issued to one Thomas Douglass, "late governor and now admiral of New York."

There is attached a small sketch of the property, showing Wall street with its fence, and the city gate, through which leads "Broad way."

When one considers that this "waste land" now represents one of the most valuable spots in the world one realizes what changes a little more than two centuries have wrought in New York city.

What would Thomas Douglass have said if he had been told that on this "waste land" would one day stand a banking institution returning its stockholders over 80 per cent a year?—Wall Street Journal.
