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THE PULLING POWER OF CHARM

A woman without charm is like a rose without fragrance, an egg without salt or corned beef without mustard. She may be as pretty or as witty as Venus or Minerva had flowered her, but if the graces or the good fairies failed to endow her with charm she is deprived of a third of her potential power.

Strictly speaking the woman without charm does not exist. The mere fact of sex constitutes a kind of charm in man or in woman for women or for men. The true test of the possession of charm probably consists in the power of women to attract other women or other men. Browning brought out this idea when he wrote: "God be thanked! The meanest of His creatures boasts two soul sides—one to face the world with, one to show a woman when he loves her." The idea of Browning has two faces, a feminine as truly as a masculine, and is applicable to a sweetheart in love with her lover as to a lover in love with his sweetheart.

But charm is more distinctively a woman's quality than a man's. We may speak of "Prince Charming," but unless the prince have character, force, imagination and masculinity in addition to charm, the epithet is likelier than not to leave a taste of sickly sentimentalism. We are liable to think Prince Charming a bit of a sissy. But the woman of charm can be charming and yet not have to be anything else in addition; that is, so far as the majority of mere men is concerned. O, charm and charmers, how many foibles and frailties escape censure where you exist! A charming girl, a woman of charm, has more pulling power over the masculine heart than an autotruck or a yoke of bulls of Bashan.

Charm defies definition. If we say that charm is gravitation in the sphere of personality, particularly

of feeling, perhaps we express the idea as nearly as may prove practicable. Gravitation is the pull of planet upon planet and charm is the attraction of personality upon personality or of one nature upon another. It finds its finest flowering in the artist, such as the supreme singer or the sovereign of the piano or violin, but it not seldom is felt forcefully in the conversation of such a burly brute as Sam Johnson or the play of a child unconscious of itself or the tender ministries of a fine-natured and great-hearted woman. —Spokesman-Review.

GASOLINE BOILING POINTS

TELL THE STORY

Contrary to the opinion held by a great many people, the real value of gasoline is not shown by the old-fashioned gravity test. This test tells nothing about the vaporizing and combustive qualities of the fuel, as has been pointed out by the National Bureau of Standards at Washington. Only the boiling point test is really efficient.

Boiling points, of course, mean exactly what the words say. That is, they are points on the thermometer at which a liquid will begin to boil. For a cold engine to start quickly the gasoline must vaporize at a low temperature. To get quick and smooth acceleration somewhat higher boiling points are necessary and for full power and long mileage the fuel must have still higher boiling points.

High quality gasoline must have a complete and continuous chain of boiling points, ranging from the low to the high. Combustion starts with the lowest and flashes on through the uniform chain from low to high with the result that there is full-powered, instantaneous combustion. Eliminate one link and the full power chain is broken. The famous Red Crown gasoline has the complete power chain.

HOME SERVICE CAMPAIGN

Everything is in readiness for the Home Service Campaign of the Salvation Army in Oregon, to be conducted under the auspices of the Oregon State Elks Association. The drive will open Sunday, June 22, and continue until June 30. The state quota is \$250,000 of which one-half, or \$125,000, is to be raised in Multnomah county and Portland.

The money which Oregon is asked to give to this organization is to be used exclusively in the work of the organization in this state. The army is not requesting any money for itself, but instead is seeking to obtain sufficient funds in this one drive to enable it to serve humanity for one year without making continual solicitation upon the public for funds every few months.

Every person has heard the story of the Salvation Army in France, where it served in the front line areas, bringing comforts of home to the American doughboys. It is this service that has focused the public eye upon the organization and which has caused inquiry into the past efforts of this body of Christian men and women.

This inquiry has established the fact that for many years past, the Salvation Army has operated in the front line trenches of vice and poverty, bringing comforts to those who had been shunned by the remainder of society. Its motto, "A man may be down, but he's never out," has won for the Salvation Army the approbation of the general public and every indication points to a large over-subscription in the forthcoming drive.

OREGON BUTTERMILKERS TURN OUT GOOD PRODUCT

Oregon buttermilkers who sent samples to the second 1919 scoring contest at the agricultural college are making an excellent product. The May entries were the most uni-

form lot received in any contest to date, reports V. D. Chappell, in charge for the college dairy department.

The best score was made by the McMinnville creamery which got 100 on composition and 46 for commercial quality, making an average of 97 1/2 per cent. The second highest went to the Mutual creamery of Portland, with 100 on composition. Other creameries making 100 on composition were Carlton and Umapine.

Some of the entries were criticised for being overworked, which made them greasy and sticky. Only two entries scored below 90. Two cubes lost for being leaky and two for being gritty, which Mr. Chappell says is without excuse. Wet salting will help prevent grit, and if salt is not all dissolved when working is half through the butter should be allowed to stand on the rollers 15 or 20 minutes before finish.

The third contest will be scored June 24, and all entries must be shipped by June 23. Full instructions for taking and shipping samples will be mailed on request to the dairy department, O. A. C., Corvallis.
