### HIGH SCHOOL AG- RICULTURE NOTES

"Agriculture—the mother of all industry, and the maintainer of human life."

It so happens, that while we have farmed, we have also gardened, which is, in fact, our specialty.

At O. A. C., and at other places, we took all the training we could get having to do with vegetable and ornamental gardening work. We mention this because we desire all to realize that our course in horticulture is to be a splendid, helpful course.

Your school board has provided—surely you will use the service. You owe it to yourself to do so.

Have your boy or girl elect horticulture beginning February 9. Vegetable and ornamental gardening will be covered next semester. Your chance to have your place improved in a way that will delight you, and at the same time, three credits earned.

Courses next semester and ground to be covered as follows:

Course No. 1—Farm soils and crops; study of farm field crops (including seed and soil identification.)

Course No. 2—Farm animals; study of management problems, with dairy and judging practice.

Course No. 3—Horticulture; study and practice in vegetable and ornamental gardening.
