OBITUARY OF JOHN D. HARDWICK

The subject of this sketch was born January 13, 1858, in Monroe county, Missouri. In 1874 he came to Yamhill county, Oregon. Here he met Miss Laura Keyes and they were married May 30, 1880. To this union were born five children, Arthur, the first born, and Julia, the fourth, both of whom died in infancy; Lillian, Mrs. Charles McKinley, of Salem; Stella, a student at Monmouth; and Clara, Mrs. Davis Rees, of Salem.

In 1898 the family moved to a farm three miles south of Salem on the Jefferson road where they have made their home for the past twenty-two years.

Mr. Hardwick was a patient sufferer for years with enlargement of the heart which resulted in his death on February 5. At the time of his death he was visiting at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Charles Rees.

Mr. Hardwick united with the Evangelical church about twenty-five years ago while living in Yamhill county and was an active member of that organization. After moving to Salem he united with the Church of Christ.

Mr. Hardwick was a man honored and respected by his acquaintances and loved by a large number of friends.

Mr. Hardwick is survived by his wife, Mrs. Laura Keyes Hardwick, three children, Mrs. Charles McKinley, Mrs. Davis Rees and Miss Stella Hardwick; three grandchildren, Margaret and Maynard McKinley, and Reginald Rees; a sister, Mrs. C. J. Leavitt, of Eugene; and two brothers, Jethro Hardwick, of Salem, and George Hardwick, of Newberg.

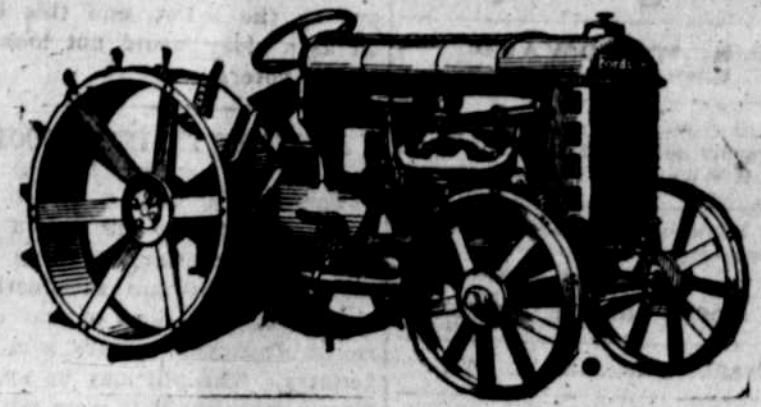
