THE HIGH SCHOOL AGRICULTURE NOTES

1. "On the successful presentation of agriculture depends the continued existence and prosperity of the whole human race."
 2. "By agriculture we are all fed and clothed and, in a large measure, are provided with dwellings and the material comforts of civilization."
 3. "Agriculture will always be the chief business of our country if we are to exist and prosper as a nation."
 4. "If there is one lesson taught by history it is that the permanent greatness of any state must ultimately depend more upon the character of its country population than anything else. No growth of cities, no growth of wealth, can make up for a loss in either the numbers or the character of the farming population."
 5. The more individual successful farmers we have, the greater will be the sum total of the individual members of our social system who are financially independent.
 6. In this day and age, real intellectual independence is practically dependent upon financial independence.
 7. The man of all men, who is in the truest sense financially independent, is the farmer. He can attain to the glorious intellectual independence—heights toward which we all (though perhaps secretly) have our eyes longingly raised.
 8. Who then is there, but can and does realize the tremendous moral obligation and responsibility that rests with the farmer.
 9. All realize that today as never before, the ultimate responsibility for efficient municipal government; for clean, fair-and-square politics; for adequate provision as to education; for anything and everything that makes for progress and greater enlightenment, rests with the individual on the farm.
 10. This does not mean that we farmers must needs rise up in our might and turn the world upside down.
 11. Neither does it mean that we must shout and orate and berate the other fellow.
 12. It does mean, however, that we must always, and unflinchingly, ally ourselves with the right, regardless of policy or expediency.
 13. Many of us, no matter what our social class, find it extremely difficult to be intellectually honest because of the pressure mainly of economic circumstances.
 14. Mr. Farmer—you have always been noted and envied because of your secure economic position. Take advantage of it. Use your power and influence for the good of those less securely entrenched. Yours is a wonderful privilege. Use it!
 15. "With malice toward none, with charity for all, with firmness in the right as God gives us to see the right, let us strive on."
