HOUSEHOLD HINTS

To ship a large picture or mirror without breaking the glass paste narrow strips of paper diagonally across the glass. This breaks the vibration and prevents damage that often results.

Always keep a piece of finest sand paper in the kitchen. If the bread or cake should get browned a bit too much it can be rubbed off more smoothly than if a greater is used.

A baking powder tin box with small holes cut in the bottom makes a sharp, quick chopper for use when warming over potatoes or vegetables.

Violet ammonia is splendid in foot bath (with quite hot water).

If you hold the hand over hot water a splinter will be removed much easier.

Onion stains can be quickly removed from the hands by rubbing with a stick of celery.

Before baking potatoes let them stand in hot water 15 minutes. They will require only half the time for baking, are more mealy and palatable, and when baked in a gas oven the saving of gas is considerable.

There are always new things in the shops for window hangings. One of the newest, and an attractive one, too, is a mottled velour of heavy texture and rich coloring. The colors are mottled indistinctly, just as they might be if they had faded from hanging in folds in the sunlight.

To remove scorch quickly dampen a white cloth with peroxide, using a piece large enough to cover the scorched place. Lay it on and iron until dry. Repeat the operation if necessary.

Much flour is saved and time also if shortcake biscuits are dropped into muffin pans instead of being rolled out. They acquire, because of less handling, a more delicate lightness.
