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BIG SUM FOR DEVELOPMENT WORK IN OREGON

With practically every community in Oregon organized the intensive canvass throughout the state in the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce expansion movement will begin June 14th. The canvass will continue until August 1st.

The educational work in connection with the expansion movement, which began several weeks ago, will continue during June and July.

Twelve men, composing six teams of two men each, will direct the intensive organization work simultaneously in six different sections of the state. They will be assisted by eighty community executive committees appointed during the statewide survey conducted preliminary to the intensive organization work.

Leading men in every section of Oregon are affiliated with the State Chamber in the capacity of committee chairmen and members in the movement to raise a budget of \$450,000 (\$150,000 a year) covering a three year period with which to carry on the development work of the State Chamber. More than two hundred endorsements have been received from these men approving the expansion movement and citing the need for such an agency as the State Chamber to take the initiative in development problems affecting the entire state.

Of the total sum to be raised, \$180,000 (\$60,000 a year) covering a three year period will be raised in Portland. The remainder of the budget totaling \$270,000 (\$90,000 a year) covering a three year period will be raised in the thirty-six counties outside of Portland.

AN OLD TIMER

There has just been installed in "Dinosaur hall" at the American Museum of Natural History, New York, a skeleton of a prehistoric deinodon. Experts calculate that this particular representative of his species flourished no fewer than 60,000,000 years ago. Even if those calculations are a trifle inaccurate, it must be admitted that the relics of this monster are old, very old, indeed.

The deinodon is also given the name of "terrible tooth." He is thought to have been the most swift and powerful creature of his time. The skeleton, which has just been mounted stands 11 feet 5 inches high and measures 20 feet from its nose to the tip of its tail. It is geologically proved that the deinodon lived during the cretaceous period of the age of reptiles.

The bones of the new addition to "Dinosaur hall" were found three years ago in the canyon of the Red Deer river, Alberta. It is assumed that the geography and climate of that region was far different 60,000,000 years ago to that which now prevails there and at that extremely remote time the country was probably warm and marshy, as the interior sea, once stretching from the Gulf of Mexico to the Arctic ocean, was gradually receding and filling up with tropical growths and swamps. The section, therefore, was highly favorable to the existence of such gigantic reptiles as this deinodon.—Salt Lake Tribune.
