BIG FUSS OVER SMALL FOX

Extensive Litigation in Prospect Because of Winter Sport in Dutchess County, New York.

Every sportsman in Dutchess county is interested in a lawsuit over the skin of a fox which already has involved two hunters, two farmers, four lawyers and one justice of the peace.

Call For Sealed Bids.

NOTICE is hereby given that in accordance with Chapter 32, Session Laws of 1920, the Land Board of the State of Oregon, will receive sealed bids at its office in the Capitol Building at Salem, Oregon, up to 11:00 o'clock A. M. on Sept. 7th, 1920, for a lease and permit to take, remove and sell sand, rock and gravel from that portion of the Willamette River in Yamhill County, described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the left bank of the Willamette River at ordinary high water line, and the east line of section 30, township 3 south, range 2 west, Willamette Meridian, in Yamhill County, Oregon; thence south following said section line to the thread of the main channel of the Willamette River, the same being the boundary line between Yamhill and Marion Counties; thence following up the thread of said river and of the channel to the South and East of Ash Island at ordinary high water line, to the down stream extremity of said island, thence southwesterly following the north and west bank of said island, at ordinary high water line to its intersection with the west line of said section 31; thence north following said section line to its intersection with the left bank of the channel on the north and west side of said island at ordinary high water line; thence in a northeasterly direction following said bank at ordinary high water line to the point of beginning.

Such bids shall specify the amount offered per cubic yard and the minimum yardage which each bidder agrees to remove or pay for each year and the term of years for which the lease is desired, and shall be accompanied by certified check for 10 per cent of the amount of the bid for one year, and by map in triplicate, showing premises and ownership of abutting property and residence and post office address of such owner or owners.

The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids, whether before or after the award, or if the bidder refuses or shall fail or neglect to execute the contract and furnish the bond specified or required by the Board, and reserves the right to lease the whole of the above described premises or any portion thereof, and the riparian owner, his assigns or representatives, subject to rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the State Land Board, will be given the preference right to lease at the highest price offered, said right to be exercised within five days after the opening of bids, subject further wholly within the discretion of the Board, to the right to lease to persons who have done development work, together with actual operation within the year 1919.

All bids shall be made subject to the terms, provisions and conditions of the rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the State Land Board of the State of Oregon, for the purpose of carrying out and making effective the provisions of chapter 32 of the General Laws of Oregon, adopted at the Special Legislative Session of 1920, and on file with the undersigned and open to public inspection.
