#### Spoiled His "Poem."

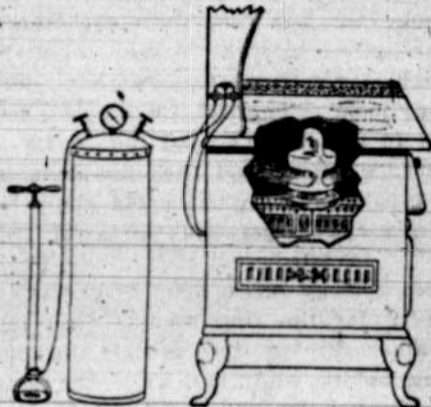

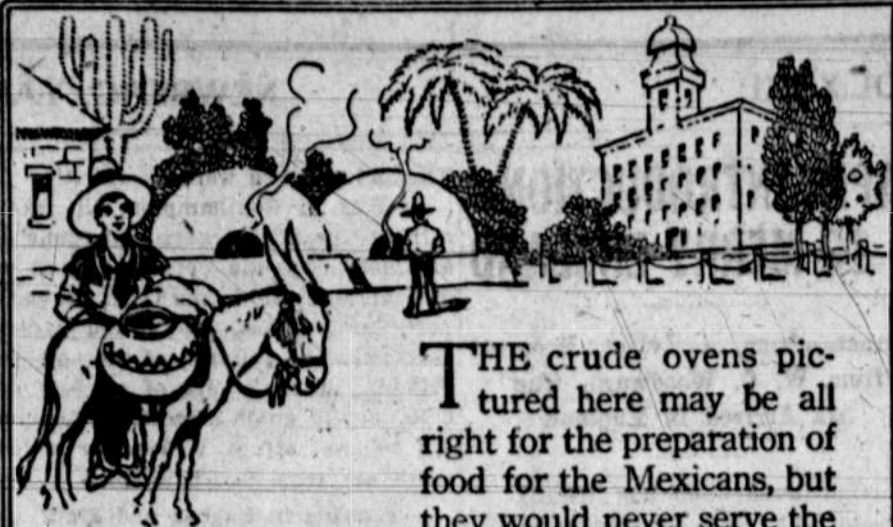
