HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

To make a glue that will adhere to glass, metal, etc., dissolve 1 tablespoon ordinary gelatine in 2 table-spoons boiling water and boil for a minute, adding a little sugar. This glue will not stain.

It is easier to bake croquettes than to fry them. It makes a pleasant variety in serving.

To keep a cookbook clean, place a pane of glass over it when it is open on the table. It keeps the right place and keeps the leaves from becoming soiled. The glass should be a trifle larger than the book and have a paste-board binding rounding the edge.

When tablecloths begin to look worn at creases cut off an narrow strip from one end so that the creases will be in a different place the next time cloth is laundered.

A large magazine rolled up makes a very good sleeve board, and padded baking powder can does very well for ironing baby's bonnet on.

To extinguish burning oil throw on it flour or earth—never water.

Instead of padding your ironing table with cloth, try several thicknesses of newspaper.

Save all the stocking tops and use them to line the knees and seats of boys' trousers where they are thin. Being elastic, the stocking tops adjust themselves smoothly and yet can be stretched if necessary.

When cooking canned peas put them in double boiler; they will be tenderer and taste more like fresh peas. Allow more time than when cooking in sauce pan.

A hot shovel held over varnished furniture will take out white spots.

Try putting seeded raisins in when you are baking cake and cookies. You will be surprised how little sugar will be needed.

When cooking rhubarb drop in a pinch of soda when it comes to boil; less sugar will be required for sweetening.

When boiling cabbage, turnip, carrot, etc., put them in separate

thin bags; you will be pleased with results especially with boiled dinner. To temper lamp chimneys—After washing pour boiling water over them; they seldom break from lighting or sudden change of temperature when so treated.
