The town of Sheephead Bay some years ago entered into an arrangement with the borough of Brooklyn whereby the contents of all the Brooklyn ash barrels were delivered for the filling in of a great swamp.

The refuse, reaching Sheephead Bay in large metal tanks, was carried out into the swamp by specially constructed trolleys and dumped. In this way some hundreds of acres were converted into dry land.

The refuse contained so much vegetable and animal matter that almost immediately grass and sunflowers began to grow on the surface of the material, and by the end of the second year thirty Italians had planted most of the area with cabbage and other vegetables. The ash dump became a truck garden.

IN CASE OF FIRE BEAR SUGGESTIONS IN MIND

Whenever any person phones in an alarm of fire, they should always give, in addition to the street and number, the name of the nearest cross street, to the fire.

If the fire company is not advised of the nearest cross street, it means a delay that may double or treble the fire loss. If they know the nearest cross street, they know where the fire plug nearest the fire is located, and go there first, leaving the hose to be attached and hasten on, the hose unwinding from the truck as they go, so that by the time they reach the fire they are able at once to use water if the chemicals are found insufficient to extinguish the blaze.

If they don't know the nearest cross street, and go to the fire first, without leaving out a line of hose, and they fail to put out the fire with the chemicals, then they have to leave the fire long enough to drive to the nearest plug to attach the hose and drive back to the fire, during which time it may have gotten beyond control.

Please bear it in mind, when you phone in an alarm of fire, be sure to give the nearest cross street to the fire, after you have given the name and number of the street where the fire is located.

LONG A BRITISH POSSESSION

Island of Bermuda Colonized Eight Years Before the Mayflower. Sailed From England.

The island of Bermuda was discovered in 1515 by a Spaniard, Juan de Bermudez. Nearly 100 years later an English vessel with Virginia colonists was shipwrecked on the island, which had been known as the Isle of Devils because of the terrific storms on its coast, and had been shunned. Admiral Sir George Somers, leading the Virginians, died. His body was taken back to England, where the colonists told the wonders of the island. The Virginia company determined to colonize the islands, and had its charter amended to include islands within 300 leagues of Virginia. As a result, 50 colonists were sent out in 1612, eight years before the Mayflower sailed. Later the Virginians sold their rights to a Bermuda company, which so subverted the inhabitants that they formed a parliament and fought for their rights. Three branches of government were devised. Regulations were most severe, and penalties were of the most extreme nature.

Artificial Wool Not Much Good.

Widespread interest having been taken in a new artificial wool, an exhaustive investigation into the properties and merits of the fiber has been made by Prof. Eber Midgley, head of the department of textile industries of the Bradford Technical college, and United States Consul A. S. Ingram of Bradford, summarizes his conclusions about as follows:

The new fiber is unsuitable for use in spinning yarn on the worsted principle. It being lacking in uniformity of diameter, strength and elasticity. When blended with pure wool the result is an uneven yarn.
