HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Place a piece of paper under lace needing mending and stitch on the machine till the hole is filled. Pick out the paper.

If you scorch a garment in ironing, rub dry starch over the stain, then sponge it off. Repeat as often as necessary.

If you mount the clothespin bag on a wooden coat hanger you can put it over the wash line and push it along as you need it.

If you have trouble in getting the jelly firm add a pinch of almond. This will make it hard.

Celery will keep a week or even longer if wrapped in brown paper, then a towel and put in a cool dark place. Before serving it let it lie in cold water for an hour to make it crisp.

Soak grass stains in alcohol, then wash out in clear water and hang in the sun to dry.

A smooth, planed strip nailed a little over half way up on the bottom section of the screen door is convenient where there are babies. When baking meat pies, if you will

stick two pieces of macaroni into the crust you will never have soft crust, as it lets out the steam more quickly.

Old stocking legs are quickly made handy holders. Turn the stockings wrong side out and cut off the foot. Fold the ends together, fold again and turn the top back over the rest. Secure with a few stitches.

Colored material that is apt to fade and shrink should be placed in hot salt water and allowed to stand to set the color and shrink the material before it is made up.

CARE PREVENTS FIRES

Oil heaters are the cause of numerous fires on account of carelessness in the use of this heating device which has been widely adopted due to high cost of coal.

Kerosene gives off vapors which are inflammable and explosive at certain temperatures and too much care cannot be used in handling this liquid.

Never fill tank when wick is lighted as it is extremely dangerous due to escaping vapor.

Keep heaters away from curtains and inflammable material. Be sure they are closed and catch fastened before carrying and do not carry when lighted as many fires have been caused in this manner by them opening and spilling oil on the floor. Defective wicks cause explosions of violence. Wicks should be thoroughly dry before using. To extinguish heater turn down wick a little and blow over top of burner. It is dangerous to blow light out from underneath or to turn wick down very low.

Oil heaters are so convenient and satisfactory that common rules of safety are often overlooked when using them.
