



THE STUDENT COUNCIL

The government of the high school is much the same as that of the city. The principal governing body in the school is the student council. This council exercises numerous powers; in McMinnville Oregon, the District ed to communicate with O. F. Kilthe student body and unprovided for in the constitution are presented to the council. The principal duties of the council as outlined in the constitution are; First, the student council shall make and amend rules and by-laws for the government of the student body and the interpetation and execution of the powers of the constitution and, shall exercise all powers granted to the student body by this constitution. Second, they shall provide for all necessary committees except that of the finance committe and, they shall administer the finances of the student body. The council shall supervise all student body activities and provide for the care of all student body property. This council is composed of six voting members, a chairman and a recorder. The President of the student body is the chairman of the council and has the right to veto any measure. The treasurer must be a faculty member but may vote in the council Each class has one delegate in the council to represent it and each delegate has a vote. The presidents of the four classes are honorary members of the council. They may attend the meetings and may at times express thier opinion
