A COMMUNICATION

There are some people in every town who are easily inflamed by suspicion and catch at straws for evidence and then start about to persuade as many others as possible, careless or else not realizing how near they are coming to mere slanders. Something like this appears to have been the situation on Monday at the school election, when false reports were circulated by certain persons concerning the school board and the candidates, apparently affecting the results of the election. It is a good rule on any election day to disregard any rumors that any one starts or attempts to pass along. Intelligent voters should know by election day what they wish to do, and count any person as under suspicion who tries to sway them at that time with sensational stories. Such stories may be nothing but campaign lies, and appearances are against the person who circulated them at that time. A dignified and prayerful regard for the truth at the polls is one of the first requisites of good citizenship, and such a citizen will receive with contempt slanderous suggestions on election day. Let the elections be clean.

A campaign of untruths seems to be on also with reference to the high school. Make any one who brings charges against this institution bring the evidence in writing and have it presented properly to any of the School Board and then it will be thoroughly investigated and corrected. But do not be moved by any excited whispers. Such persons are working injury to the public school of which they ought to be the helpers. Some have even put themselves in the light of trying to build up the academy at the expense of the high school and of truth with reference to it. If the high school is not as good as any other school of its grade, it should be made so. And can be made so. Persons who have grievances or know of things needing correction, should have these things brought before the board; they will undoubtedly be attended to. Good schools are of first importance, and good citizens who are helpers in this work.
