Every Business Licensed

The city council of Newport has passed an ordinance which requires a license from every business in the city. Some of them which must pay the license are: Agate Supplies and Curios, \$50 for a year; attorneys, \$10; auctioneers, \$10 a day; hotels and boarding houses, 50c for each dining chair used by guests; book agents, \$1 a day; barbers, \$10 for first chair, \$5 for each additional chair; bowling alleys, \$5; banks \$100; bakeries, \$10; doctors, \$10; drug stores, \$50; meat markets, \$25; newspapers, \$10; pool hall and billiard tables, \$5; moving pictures, \$50; tent shows, \$2.50 to \$5 per day. This license money goes into a special fund, known as the "Emergency and Amusement Fund."
