#### STRAWBERRY GROWERS FIND ADVERTISING PAYS

Strawberry growers believe that advertising pays since they used it in moving their crop.

When the strawberry season opened this year the California growers were offered 31/2 cents a pound by canners for their berries. They felt that this was too low and that the crop should be moved fresh. The growers adopted an advertising campaign which enabled them to move the entire crop at 8 cents a pound through the local markets.

Results were obtained the first day with the advertising campaign. By an agreement with the canners all of the strawberries not sold by 11 o'clock each day were to be barreled Only the canners. reled. Only the first day found any berries left for the canners so well did the advertising succeed.

A modest sum, was used in ad vertising in newspapers and journals of the bay cities and retailers were furnished with posters announcing fresh strawberries to the trade. The growers received a fair price, the wholesaler made a profit, the retailer was kept busy and the public bought generously. A single day's slump in the general strawbery market would have cost the grow-
