ORDINANCE NO. 577

An Ordinance requiring all persons owning any building within the city of Newberg, Oregon, used as a residence or for business purposes, to install toilets and connect the same with the sewer system of said city where such sewer is available, and to remove all outside toilets, providing a penalty for violation hereof and declaring an emergency.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF NEWBERG DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: All persons owning any building in the City of Newberg, Oregon, used either for residence or business purposes, shall cause toilets to be installed in such building or buildings and connect the same with the sewer system of said city, wherever such sewer is available.

Section 2: Any person owning any property upon which is situated an outside toilet, and having a sewer available, or where a septic tank can be installed, where no sewer is available, shall cause such outside toilet to be removed and the vault of such toilet to be properly filled with earth.

Section 3: Any person violating

any provision of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof before the Recorder of the City of Newberg, shall be punished by payment of a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$20.00 for each offence, and each week that such offense shall continue shall be deemed a separate offense under this ordinance.

Section 4: By reason of the fact that outside toilets are a menace to the health of the community, and the further fact that a sewer system has been provided for the inhabitants of the City of Newberg which is available in nearly all sections of said city, and that such toilets are a nuisance in said city: THEREFORE, an emergency is hereby declared and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten days after its approval by the mayor.
