DARWINISM IS DEAD

Some books and papers and teachers not abreast of the times, keep presenting the Darwinian theory, and founding their work upon it, as if it were really in vogue today among scientists. And the effect is destructive to the mind of youth, to their faith and to their proper information. But much that is called science changes from decade to decade, and the latest word is that such a change has taken place with respect to the theory of Darwin, so loudly acclaimed a few years ago.

Associated Press reports tell of a recent convention of the American Association for the Advancement of Science at Toronto, and among other things report Prof. William Bateson's address, a world-famous English biologist, in which he openly declared "that it was impossible for scientists any longer to agree with Charles Darwin's theory of the origin of species;" that while forty years ago this theory was accepted generally, scientists have come to a point today where they no longer claim to have any explanation to offer of the genesis of species. They cannot find in mere unaided human discovery any light upon the origin of man. The only explanation today is that of man's creation as told in God's Word.
