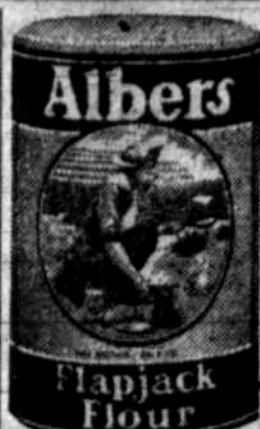
S. P. REDUCES ROUND TRIP TICKETS TO PORTLAND

The Southern Pacific Co. has re-
duced fares to Portland and return
effective May 26 and lasting until
September 30. Under these new
rates week end tickets will be sold
at \$1.15 round trip while special
fifteen day tickets will be sold for
\$1.10 round trip. Season tickets
will sell for \$1.50 for the round trip
to Portland. The week end tickets
will be on sale Friday, Saturday,
and Sunday, while the fifteen day
tickets will be sold only on Friday
and Saturday and the season tickets
will be on sale every day. This new
special rate makes railroad travel so
cheap that one cannot afford to
drive one's own car when going to
Portland.

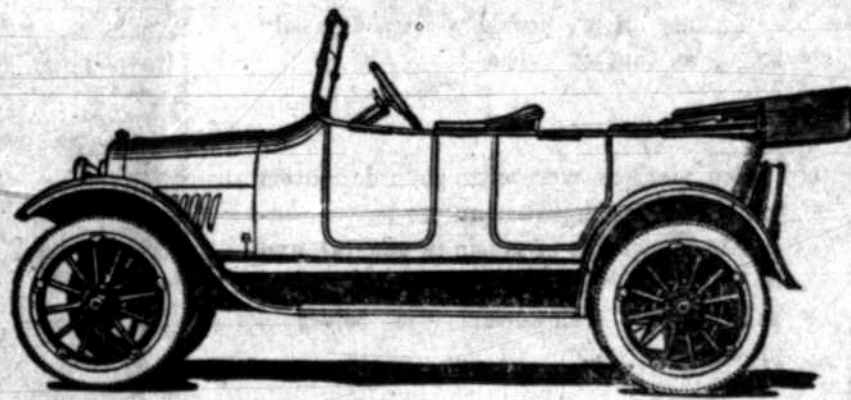
