A resolution was adopted by this congregation instructing the trustees to have amended the articles of incorporation to read "Church of Christ" in place of "Christian church." This action was taken as a matter of consistency for, as a people, we refuse to be denominated by any name for which a specific passage of scripture cannot be produced warranting its use. The designation "church of Christ" is thoroughly scriptural, non-sectarian, non-divisive, undebatable one for local congregations of the church of Christ. Paul knew and recognized "churches of Christ" (Rom. 11:16) and it is certain that the only difference between them was that of geographical location. The world needs the services of the churches of Christ and it behooves all organizations claiming to be such, in the interests of Christ's cause and for the perfect enlightenment of those who use common sense, to proclaim to the world that they are churches of Christ and not some other kind of churches. This congregation desires to recognize the right of all christian assemblies to wear such names as they choose, but prefers to be known as a church of Christ composed of disciples of Christ who have been divinely called Christians. (Acts 11:26). In this way there can, and will be, harmony among Christ's people, which is the desire of this congregation.

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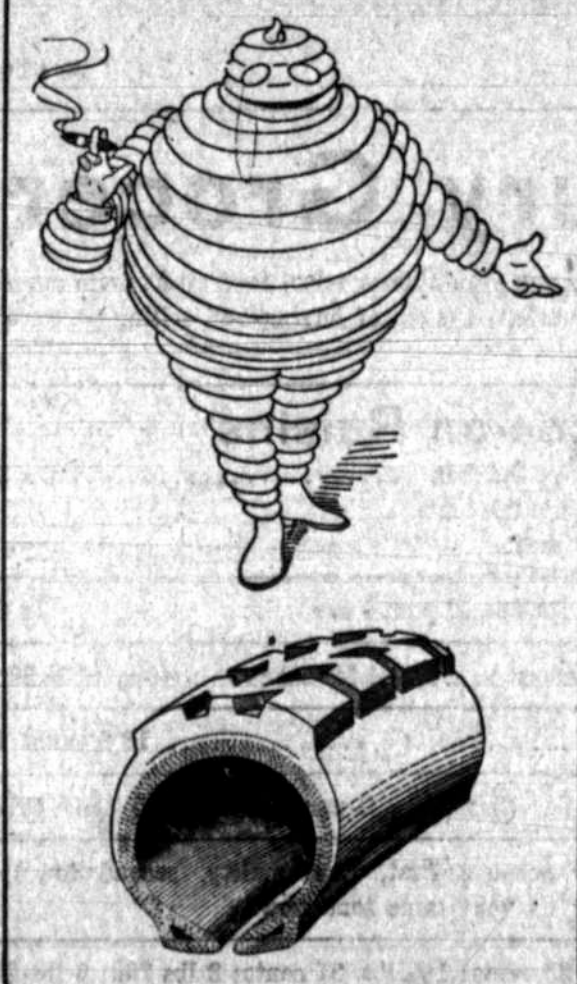
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
