FORMER EDITOR OF GRAPHIC GIVES ENDORSEMENT TO ARTICLE IN OREGONIAN

Believes There Is Great Danger in Stirring Up Sectarianism in Political Arena—Article by Tillamook Clergyman Warns Against Departure from Spirit of Christ's Teachings

I am enclosing an article that appeared in the Oregonian Tuesday, which I think is worthy of careful reading on the part of all loyal citizens, and of course this is what we all claim to be.

Any attempt to stir up strife and array one sect against another or one race of people against another is un-American, and when carried to an extreme tends to breed lawlessness.

Many well meaning people are often prone to be carried away on the wave of secret propaganda and just now it seems to me that it is well to do some sober thinking.

The article to the Oregonian follows:

Europe is tottering on the verge of another awful world war because each European nation has surrounded itself with a petty wall of racial division of national jealousy, suspicion, egotism and hatred. In Ireland the fires of political-religion are raging and both Catholics and Protestants are drawn into one long, fierce struggle for national supremacy and political control. To gain this political power pillage, fire, ambush, famine and sword are used and the result is destruction, desolation and death to both Protestant and Catholic who happen to stand in its pathway.

In Oregon those who dare inject political-religion into the field of public education and personal political strife are playing with high explosives dangerous alike to both church and state. Roman Catholics and Protestants alike have been guilty of trying to harness the religion of Christ to political power and subject it to the will of pope or king. History has thereby been blackened and the wreckage of civilization and horror of human war have always resulted from the attempt.

Today, when the world's civiliza-

tion and Christianity itself are hanging in the balance and when the world's political, economic, industrial and religious existence is in jeopardy, any man, party or nation which causes division, strife, hatred and war is an enemy of both God and man. Verily the curse of God will be upon any man, party or nation that, knowingly or unwittingly, plunges civilization into another black hell of war, and upon the red radical who destroys life and property in the name of brotherhood and freedom.

True Christianity, whether it be expressed by Roman Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, Calvinist or Armenian, is a spiritual life in the soul of the individual, which transforms the inner motives to that they are conformed to the spirit, life and teaching of Jesus Christ.

So, then, today in Oregon we have no time nor place for Catholic or anti-Catholic to force our public schools into a bitter political-religious war. We have no time nor place for Protestant nor anti-Protestant to raise the cry of extermination and destruction to all opinion unfavorable to itself in the name of the loving Christ. We have no time nor place for the Klan or the anti-Klan to bring division, hatred and strife into every community and country of Oregon in the name of an Americanism that would destroy America.

Jesus Christ was no narrow sectarian Pharisee filled with ecclesiastical pride and dogmatism. He was no mere partisan Jew who sacrificed his life on a Roman cross to gain national power for his nation. He was neither nationalist nor internationalist, but a supernaturalist, whose divine message of truth is able to save the nations of the world if they will have His spirit of love for their hatred.

CAMPAIGN TO SECURE EMPLOYMENT FOR DISABLED

For the purpose of securing employment for disabled war veterans, a campaign will be conducted throughout the northwest August 21 to 26 by the U. S. veterans' bureau, according to A. E. McCabe, district head of the newly organized employment section of the bureau. More than 900 veterans of Washington, Oregon and Idaho have completed their training courses and several hundred more are scheduled to finish their vocational work within the next two or three months, he stated.

"These fellows who could not carry on their pre-war vocations because of war injuries surely deserve consideration in the matter of employment," said Mr. McCabe. They have struggled for months and in many cases years to master a new occupation. However, we are not asking employers to hire these veterans for sentimental reasons but rather because they are now capable office workers, tradesmen or industrial workers. The veterans' bureau vouches that the rehabilitated service man will hold down the job he is recommended for."

Employers are urged to get in touch with one of the branch offices of the veterans' bureau located in Seattle, Portland, Spokane, Tacoma, Boise and Pocatello during "Veteran's Employment Week."
