REVIEW OF PRUNE SITUATION GIVEN BY M. J. NEWHOUSE

The prune situation, from a marketing standpoint, might easily become very serious, according to M. J. Newhouse, assistant general manager of the Oregon Growers cooperative association, in a review of the present outlook.

The association, which has sold 90 per cent of the 1922 crop, plans to advertise quite extensively in order to place Oregon prunes before the consumers, and to stimulate sales in the future. At least one-sixth of a cent per pound will be expended this year by the Oregon Growers cooperative association and the Clarke County Packing corporation, according to present plans. This will be the largest advertising campaign ever staged in the interest of the Oregon prune, it is stated. "What the prune growers need," says Mr. Newhouse, "is wider organization. Every grower should be in some kind of an organization which would make possible a greater advertising campaign more markets and wider distribution."

The harvest season, it is believed, will be longer than usual this year, which will decrease congestion in the driers with an expected reduction in loss of fruit. The drop which was reported as abnormal in many sections has been relieved by the rain. Fruit in all sections will size up considerably, but it is believed small sizes will predominate.

FORMER NEWBERG MAN GIVES TILLAMOOK BETTER LIGHTS

The local lighting and power plant, which was taken charge of in 1914 by C. J. Edwards and associates, has made great strides in the eight years under their management. At that time the plant consisted of only a small automatic engine and had a small number of consumers. Now there is a 24 hour service, while at that time the service was only night service. Now there are over 1200 consumers of electricity. The plant at that time generated only 265,655 K. W. H. and last year the output was 1,800,720 K. W. H. The lines at present extend out into the farming communities and up the beach as far as Brighton. The company has lately put in service a Reo speed wagon fully equipped with tools and supplies for the service crew.—Tillamook Headlight.

OREGON GROWERS ASSN. WILL CLOSE PRUNE POOLS

Action favoring an early closing of the 1922 prune pools and the creation of separate pools for the French and Oregon varieties was taken by the directors of the Willamette valley district of the Oregon Growers cooperative association at a recent meeting held in Salem, according to board members. It was stated that the pools should be closed in order to protect members who will benefit by high prices obtained by the association, and who would otherwise sustain a loss due to a probable price decline.

New members who sign up after the pools are closed will have to accept the prices obtained for their fruit through a second pool created for their benefit it was announced, should a large additional tonnage be signed up. The suggested date for closing the pools is September 15th. However, final action will be taken by the board, but it is understood that the Willamette valley will insist upon an early closing.

J. S. GRAVES SOLD FARM

J. S. Graves, who has been living in the Chehalis Center district for many years has traded his property there for 170 acres about one mile from Council, Idaho. His new ranch contains 80 acres of irrigated land, 50 acres in dry land alfalfa and the irrigated land is sown with some clover and timothy. There is some fruit on the place and a fine spring of cold mountain water. In the trade a Mr. Cool, a banker from Council, acquires the Graves property in Chehalis Center and will make this his home.

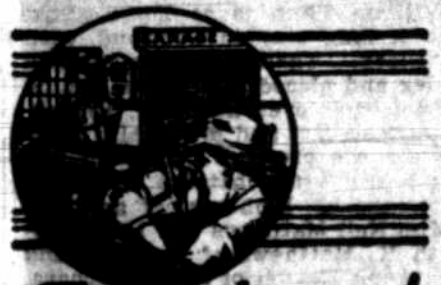
