#### **WOODBURN CLUB ORGANIZED**

The Woodburn community club, the object of which is to promote the welfare of this community, was organized last Friday night by the election of L. A. Beckman, president; H. M. Austin, vice-president; O. M. Berrie, secretary-treasurer, and Eugene Courtney and C. F. Whitman to act with the officers as a board of directors. Thirty-nine joined the membership roll and it is fully expected that more will join in and make it at least an even hundred.

#### **HIGHWAY LOOPS TO BE MADE BEAUTIFUL**

After Judge Wilson had opened a special session of circuit court and a jury had been called Tuesday, the condemnation proceedings brought by the state highway commission against V. T. Beaugregard for acquiring property within the loops of the Columbia river highway just east of town were settled in a conference of Assistant Attorney General Devers, District Attorney Baker, County

Judge Hasbrouck and Judge Derby, the latter representing the defendant. The complaint stated that Mr. Beaugregard had been offered \$1,000 for the property. Under the terms of the agreement he will receive \$1500 and the rights to certain salvage. The state and county will join equally in the purchase. A beautification of the loops will be started at once.—Hood River Glacier.

#### **NO MORE PAVING THIS YEAR**

The county has decided to do no more paving this year, consequently no more streets in Woodburn will be paved until next spring or summer. This is bad news for the good streets advocates on Harrison, Young, Hardcastle and East Lincoln thoroughfares. A delegation went to Salem Monday morning to interview Rear Master Culver regarding getting Harrison street paved this year. Mr. Culver came down in the afternoon and said he would do so if the council gave him a written order to do the work, but advised against it as the base had not settled sufficiently after the grading. As the city would have to give a guarantee to keep it in repair for five years, it was decided to accept Mr. Culver's advice.—Woodburn Independent.

#### **RUSSIANS ARE COMING TO ATTEND O. A. C.**

President Kerr has been advised that a group of Russians, one of several groups planning to enter American colleges this year, will enter O. A. C. this fall. During the past months many of these young men have been working in the lumber camps of Washington, and they are working their way through college.—Corvallis Gazette-Times.

#### **HOUSEHOLD HINTS**

The easiest way to wash windows is to use chamois skin. Use one for washing the windows, and have a larger one in a clean basin of warm water. Wring this as dry as possible and wipe. This leaves no lint, which is so annoying in window cleaning.

To mend a crack on the inside of a range, use a filling made of equal parts of wood ashes and common salt moistened with water. It will be hard and lasting.

A corn popper will be found very useful for washing raisins, currants and small fruits as the cover can be locked on and the whole shaken in a pan of water. When held under the faucet the wire mesh breaks the force of the stream and the fruit isn't wasted by being crushed or broken.

Keep a piece of the finest sand paper in the kitchen. If bread or cake should bake a bit too much it can be rubbed off more smoothly than if a grater is used.
