Petition for Incorporation is Signed.

IN COUNTY COURT NOV. 26TH

People Will Vote on the Question of Incorporating -- Limits of the Town.

A petition for the incorporation of the city of Bend has been signed by 49 voters and will be presented to the county court November 26, after three weeks' publication. The county court, unless objection shall be found, will give notice of an election to determine whether the incorporation shall be made. The election shall be conducted in accordance with the general election laws of the state. At such election there shall be chosen a mayor, six aldermen, a recorder (who shall be ex-officio clerk of the common council), a marshall and a treasurer. The mayor and council are required to serve without pay.

This much done, the new corporation is set up in business ond may conduct its affairs as it may please within the law. Thereafter saloon and other license moneys will go into the local municipal treasury and will defray the expenses of police regulation. The incorporation can deal with the problems of water and sewerage service as it pleases

Cotumbia Southern is in Hands of O. R. & N.

E. E. Lytle Remains Official Head of the Road for Three Years at \$10,000 a Year.

Now it leaks out that the Columbia Southern railroad has been sold out to the O. R. & N. for \$750,000; that the sale really took place early last winter when the announcement of an extension into Central Oregon was made; that President E. E. Lytle remains as the official head of the corporation for three years at \$10,000 a year, but the future conduct of the property is entirely in the hands of Edward H. Harriman as the controlling force in the O. R. & N.

The Columbia Southern system embraces 77 miles of track bonded for \$10,000 a mile and the O. R. & N. holds the bonds. Of course. the purchase price must have been over and above the bonded indebt-edness. The road has been economically managed and it has paid a good return on its capital.

No change in the attitude of the Columbia Southern toward an extension into Central Oregon is brought by this announcement. It is supposed the road will be extended to Cross Keys within a year but any further reach southward is regarded as improbable. Indeed, so well convinced of this have capitalists become that the people interested in the Dufur road out of The Dalles, which is as yet only an imperfect grade without iron or ties, profess to be ready to supply money for building to Bend. Meanwhile Bend scans the western horizon for evidences of a railroad.

Fifteen Sections That are Released from Withdrawal Order.
