Last year the thermometer indicated only 9 above zero on the coldest day in November; this year the coldest November day was 21 above. But this month has shown colder weather than December 1903, mercury last Saturday night going down to 5 above. Last winter's coldest day was in February, 4 above. Last winter was comparatively hard. The weather this season has been quite delightful.

Guilty as indicted was the verdict against Horace O. McKinley, S. A. D. Pater, Dan W. Turpley, Frank H. Walgamot and Emma L. Watson closing the celebrated land fraud case recently tried in Portland. The jury was out only half an hour. Marie L. Ware was found not guilty of this particular conspiracy, but trial on two other charges is still hanging over her. Those convicted in this trial are also to be tried on two other charges. The mills of the government have been grinding very slowly but they are grinding pretty fine, and more than the present cases are in the hopper.

THE BEND ELECTION.

There is a great deal that is uncertain about application of the laws of Oregon to the impending Bend election. The decision of the county authorities that the Australian ballot law does not apply seems to be warranted. This leaves open the question as to what law does apply. Bend is not a municipality, therefore the laws for elections in municipal corporations will not fit the situation here. In fact, there is no express provision of the statutes that just meets our case. It is set down that the general election laws of the state shall govern the setting up of the new municipality, but the general election laws do not mention the contingency that we face here. Therefore the rule governing the conduct of this election will be simply such as will secure to the qualified voters an opportunity to express their preference on the matters concerning which they have votes.

While the method of preparing for and conducting the election in such cases is not clearly set forth in the statutes, the qualifications of those who may participate in the election are clear. The general law provides that voters must be citizens of the United States or have declared their intention to become such and must have been residents of the state for at least six months prior to the election. The law authorizing the incorporation of municipalities provides that voters at such special elections must have resided for 30 days prior to the election within the area proposed for incorporation.

Hearing of the contest of John Sisemore against the desert land entry of Temperance O. Harman began Wednesday morning before United States Commissioner Lawrence and is likely to occupy the remainder of the week. It is on two grounds—that the land is not of desert character under the law, and that the annual expenditure required by law to reclaim it has not been made.

New Telephone Arrangements.

The telephone line to Prineville is soon to be entirely reconstructed, the present sawed poles to be superseded by peeled poles and a full metallic circuit to take the place of the present ground circuit. This will add greatly to the efficiency of the line.
