**Death of Joseph Whitfield.**

Joseph Whitfield died at his home near Lava postoffice last Monday at 10 o'clock. David Hill, who was staying with the old man, left him in good health and spirits and went to do some chores about the place. When he returned Whitfield was breathing his last. Asthma and heart failure are supposed to have caused the death.

Mr. Whitfield was an Englishman by birth, writes Mrs. W. P. Vandever to The Bulletin. He filled the office of justice of the peace in this precinct for about five years, discharging the duties of the office with credit to himself and honor to the friends who elected him. He was an honest citizen, a warm-hearted, faithful friend and a kind neighbor. He will be greatly missed in this community.

Mr. Whitfield had lived at Lava about 12 years. He settled upon a homestead there and completed title a number of years ago. He was nearly 70 years of age. The funeral took place Wednesday, the burial being at C. B. Allen's. Deceased left a small estate and no known relatives in this country.
