LESS LAND TO APPLICANTS.

An important raling of the secretary of the interior has just been promulgated, whereby the total amount of non-mineral government land to which one person is entitled is reduced from 480 to 320 acres. > If one now takes 320 acres of desert land he has no homestead or timber right left. If he takes a full homestead and a full timber claim he has no right to a desert claim. He is entitled to all three forms of entry, but he cannot take more than 320 acres in all. Before this new ruling it was possible for one to take 480 acees in all, of nonmineral land.
