Tax On Migratory Livestock.

A suit is pending in the supreme which provided for the taxation of Knight, voluntary observer: migratory livestock. The act provided that the owner of livestock shall pay the taxes thereon, at the \$1.50 time of assessment at the rate of so the last levy. If the stock should be taken into another county, he must pay a tax on them in proportion to the time they are pastured in that county, and will be entitled to collect from the first county the amount of money he has paid to

the second. The purpose of the law was to enable each county to collect a tax on livestock for the time the stock may be ranged within its borders. The principal objection to the law is that it provides an unequal rate ... 6 a. m. daity of taxation, for the owner of migratory livestock must pay at the rate levied for the previous year, while all other property is taxed according to a rate levied after the assessment. The new law was expected to discourage the driving of stock from one county to another, to make a fair division of the tax upon migratory livestock, and, incidentally, to lessen the range
