Dr. Nichol has been marketing some of his cabbages this week, raised on "worthless" Deschutes land. Many of the heads are 40 inches in circumference and weigh 20 pounds or more.

An irrigation lateral is being constructed to supply water from the Central Oregon canal to supply the Zell ranch, about 18 miles east of town. The new ditch will be three miles long.

A row of locust trees was set out on the Drake lawn next to the rock wall on Wall street this week. Many other citizens are preparing the ground and setting out trees and shrubs this fall, for the beautifying of their yards.

Theo. G. Becker has been transferred from the offices of the D. I. & P. Co., at Redmond to be time keeper at Camp 1, succeeding Edward Foster in that position. Mr. Foster was called away by the death of his friend, Fred Wolf.

Sixteen Bend people went to Laidlaw Friday night to attend a social dance and are unceasing in their praise of the quality of the hospitality shown them while there. They enjoyed a delightful dance and lunch, and the ride in the clear moonlight was not the least among the pleasures of the trip.

Interest in the reading room is increasing and there is coming to be quite a brisk demand for the books and periodicals. A. H. Grant has contributed three volumes -- Ivanhoe, Pope's Essays and Emerson's Essays. All are invited to visit the reading room, which is kept open every afternoon.

John Knox passed east of Bend Saturday, on the way home to the Knox ranch on Newsom creek with 3,000 sheep, which have been on the range near the head of the Little Deschutes all summer. Mr. Knox and his herder killed three bears this season which had been attracted about the camps by their desire for fresh mutton.

Mr. and Mrs. Ira J. Wilkinson and two daughters, Misses Bessie and Nina, arrived late last Friday night from Minneapolis, Minn., in company with their son and brother, W. R. Wilkinson, who met them with teams at Shaniko. They are now stopping at the home of the latter. Mr. Wilkinson has ditch land adjoining his son's tract two miles northeast of Bend, and intends to locate permanently here.

Pumping Plant for Irrigation.

R. M. Morris, who resides at Trail Crossing on Crooked river, is soon to have installed a monster hydraulic ram, which will pump water to irrigate 200 acres of land. Teams have gone to Shaniko to bring in the machinery. The ram is five times as large as the one put in for the Bend Water, Light & Power Company and has, under the conditions in which it will be operated, a theoretical capacity for lifting 200 gallons of water to a height of 220 feet per minute.

Fred Hesse, of Portland, who installed the ram for the water works company here, will have charge of the work of putting in the new pumping plant. He arrived at Bend last Saturday and went to Trail Crossing Monday. In talking of the new plant with Mr. Hesse, it was suggested that the pumping system of irrigation was largely impractical at present.

"Yes, it is pretty much of a problem, but it is one our company is confident of solving," said he. "We are making machines as near 'fool proof' as possible. It doesn't take much mechanical ability to handle them. If we can show this system to be a success, it will mean several more like it. There are many other settlers along the river who want pumping plants and are only waiting to be shown a machine doing successful work before making an outlay for one. The rivers in Crook county afford innumerable opportunities for the use of a hydraulic ram."

The Morris plant will cost him in the neighborhood of \$1,500.
