Registration.

Registration books opened by county clerks, Tuesday, January 3, 1906.

Direct Primary Election.

County clerks give notice of primary election and later close March 10.

Initiative Petitions.

Last day for filing pamphlets advocating measures, December 31, 1905.

General Election.

Last day for filing certificates of nomination for state officers by assembly of electors, April 19, 1906.

General Election, June 4.

Petitions for associations of district officers, such as county judge, district attorney, probate and joint representatives, must be filed in the office of secretary of state and not in the office of county clerk, and the same governing associations for state officers are applicable.

Mark Twain on Woman Suffrage.

In Mark Twain's "Following the Equator" is a couple of pages devoted to woman suffrage in New Zealand in which he gives the official figures showing that women vote in that country in as great a proportion as do the men.

Laidlaw Fenced In.
