Direct Primary Election. County clerks give notice of primary election not later than March 25.

Initiative Petitions. Last day for filing pamphlets advocating measures, December 30, 1905.

General Election. Last day for filing certificates of nomination for state officers by assembly of electors...

General Election, June 4. Petitions for annulment of district officers, such as circuit judge, district attorney...
