A TYPICAL PRINEVILLE TRICK.

It may be that Crook county will always be a mere tail to the Prineville kite. It may be that Crook county will always pour its taxes into Prineville's lap.

This is the Prineville idea of a square deal. When the rest of the world expresses a different notion, Prineville kicks and bites, bucks and rears and paws the air, squeals and howls and squaks, and goes on a spree more dreadful than its ordinary state.

It is safe to say that no part of Crook county desires that there shall be inadequate facilities for transacting the public business. The lack has not been of facilities, but of men to do what they receive pay for doing—look after the public interest.

The public, it must be remembered, has some rights. When a court house is built the taxpayers pay for it. If they do not want a new court house is it for some petty ring to say they must have it and pay a pretty price for it?

THE TRUSTS VS. THE PEOPLE.

Liquor Dealers Fighting Equal Suffrage and Favoring the Local Option Amendment.

The liquor trust, like the other trust, has set out to fight the equal suffrage amendment. The Brewers and Wholesale Liquor Dealers' Association of Oregon has sent out to all the retail liquor sellers a secret circular declaring that "it will take 50,000 votes to defeat woman suffrage."

The Circular Letter.

The secret circular above referred to follows. It is thus seen that the wholesale liquor men claim the fatherhood of the local option amendment and it evidently is drawn in the liquor business interests. This should decide all voters who desire good government to cast their ballot against the proposed local option amendment.

There are 2,000 retailers in Oregon. That means every retailer must himself bring in 25 votes election day. Every retailer can get 25 votes. Besides his employees, he has his butcher, his landlord, his laundrymen and every person he does business with.
