

SIGN RECLAMATION CONTRACT

D. I. & P. Co. Must Complete S. tem in Four Years.

SALEM, Or., June 18 .- The state land board and the Deschutes Irrigation & Power Company yesterday signed the new reclamation contract covering future work on the Pilot Butte Development Company and Onegon Irrigation Company segregations, aggregating about 100,000 acres. The new contract, briefly summarized, requires the reclamation system to be completed in four years from date. The amount of the lien on unsold land is increased from \$10 to \$25 an acre, on an average, but the annual water charge is reduced from \$1 to 80 cents an acre. The contract provides that at the expiration of 10 years from date the company must turn the system to a w c users' association if one should be organized and demand such action.

Hereafter the reclamation work is to be done by districts and whenever any district has been supplied with water the state land board will apply to the government for a patent and then throw the land open to settlers. No sales can be made until the board has given authority. Settlers are required to cultivate at least one-eighth of their land within three years after purchase. The quantity of water to be furnished in 1.8 acre-feet during the irrigation season of 90 days. This means sufficient water to cover the land to a depth of 1.8 feet.

Sales that have been made here tofore are in no way affected by the new/contract with the Deschutes Irrigation & Power company though the holders of present contracts can make an additional payment if they desire and come under the new regulations. The new contract was drawn by the Attorney-General and state engineer under instructions from the state land board .-Oregonian.

Teachers Elected.

At a meeting of the Bend school board Thursday afternoon the following teachers were elected for the year 1907-08: Principal, Miss Ruth Reid, at a salary of \$90 per month; intermediate grades, Misses Marion Wiest and Maude Vande-

spectively; primary, Miss Nellis lames, \$60 per month. Mrs. F. F Smith, who taught the primary grades last year, was not an appli cant for re-election. Miss Cora Ferguson was elected teacher for the Arnold school provided she will accept the position at \$50 per month

The board also decided to equip one of the up-stair rooms for use and to instail sanitary appliances throughout the building. During the coming year four teachers will be employed in the town schools, instead of three as heretofore. Bend's school system is expanding and will keep fully in line with the growing needs of this section.
